Supporting learning at home.

Your child will be given spelling and timetables fortnightly on alternate weeks. Children will be tested on these two weeks after being given them. Please support your child with learning these. Homework is given on Fridays to be returned to school on a Tuesday.

Reading and phonics

Children are required to read for a minimum of 20 minutes every day. This can be independently or to an adult but all children would benefit from answering questions about their book in order to improve their comprehension. When a book has been completed children will be expected to complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader. In addition, all children must record their reading on a daily basis into their planner. Parents are required to sign planners weekly. Planners will be checked each Monday.
